A good book is like a good meal. A simile suggesting that a book may be as (mentally) nourishing and satisfying as a meal. A wire is a road for electrons. A metaphor suggesting that electrons actually do use a wire as a road to travel on.

Difference Between a Metaphor and a Simile.

I suppose personification is a metaphor by proxy. Consider: An angry, cantankerous wind blew the boat to and fro. This is personification because "angry" and "cantankerous" describe human attitudes, not attributes of wind.
